The conference aims to promote the exchange and discussion of new stress research and to coordinate and strengthen Danish stress research. We encourage all with interests in stress research to participate.

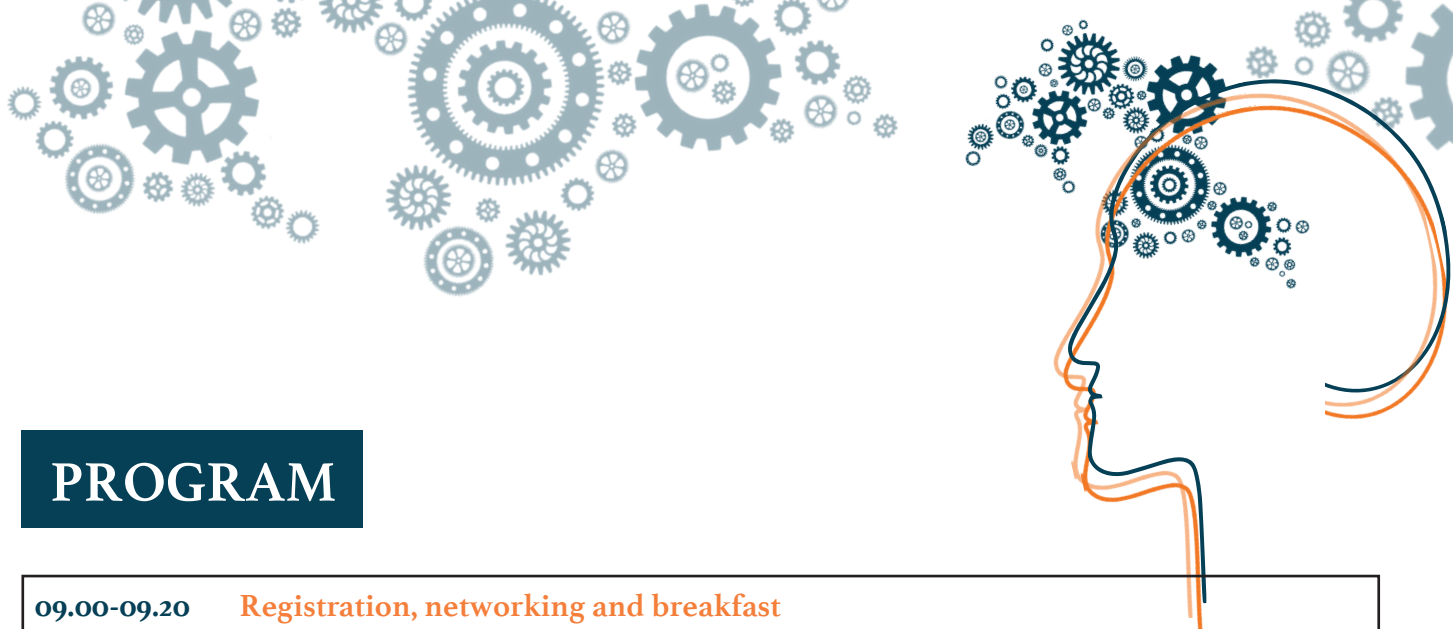
