


Research Conference

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

We invite all researchers to submit their abstract within studies on stress in its broadest sense for presentation at the 18th Stress Research Conference.

Deadline: September 4th, 2022. Approved abstracts will be selected for either oral presentation or poster presentation. Feedback will be given by email in late September 2022.

The abstracts, posters, and oral presentations will be in English. The abstract must not exceed 300 words and should be structured: Background, Methods, Results, Discussion, and Conclusion. Please state the primary affiliation of each co-author and note the presenting speaker with *.

REGISTRATION

The participation fee is 500 DKK (students: 200 DKK). Participation is free of charge for the presenting author (oral presentations and posters). Registration opens in August 2022. Invitations will be distributed on LinkedIn.


KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

This year we are delighted to present 2 keynote speakers:

Associate Professor, Mette Lykke Nielsen, Danish Centre for Youth Research, Aalborg University, will speak about poor well-being and stress when young people enter the labour market.

Our other keynote speaker is Professor Naja Hulvej Rod, Head of the Section of Epidemiology at Department of Public Health, University of Copenhagen. Naja will be speaking about stress in a life-course perspective based on results from the Danish Life Course (DANLIFE) Cohort.
